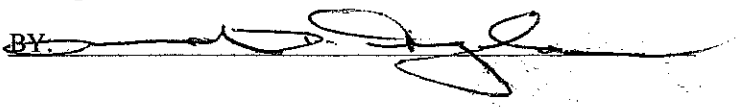

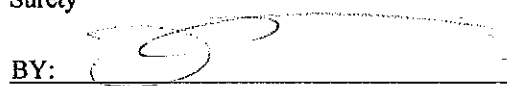

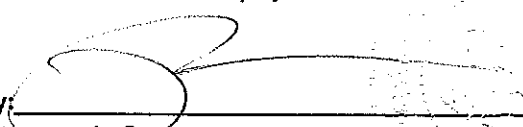

Early Lease/Purchase of Dump/Snowplow Truck From 2016-2017 Budget
 Approve and authorize the lease/purchase of two dump/snowplow trucks from the 2016-2017 Budget

Explanation:

We are requesting that Council approve the purchase or lease of two additional dump/snow plow trucks now, so that they can be put into service in time use during the entire coming winter.

There is a minimum of 220 day turnaround from the date a dump/snow plow truck/ is ordered until the day that new truck is received. This means that when trucks are ordered in July or August, following Council approval of purchase of truck as Council did in the most recent budget year, those truck won't be delivered and ready to use until the following spring, which means we lose an entire winter's use of this new equipment.

We intend to request the lease/purchase of two new dump/snow plow trucks in the upcoming budget cycle. However, if Council approvals this request in July, we will again find ourselves ordering these trucks in July or August and not receiving them until spring 2017, again losing an entire winter's use. **To shortstop this delay, we request that Council approve the purchase or lease of two additional dump/snow plow trucks NOW, to be paid for in the 2016-2017 budget, so that they can be put into service in time use during the entire coming winter.** Cost of leasing these vehicles will be approximately \$41,000/year for 5 years. Cost to purchase would be approximately \$195,000 each. We would like to make ordering trucks early like this an annual component of our 10 year Vehicle Rotation Plan.

Our current fleet consists of three 2007 trucks, three 2003 trucks and one 2000 truck. (We had 8 trucks, but the cost to repair the 1999 truck was not cost effective so we sold it at auction). We had several breakdowns of this aging fleet this winter. This hampers our ability to provide the level of service our residents expect and deserve. It also greatly increases the cost to operate the fleet and can compromise safety.

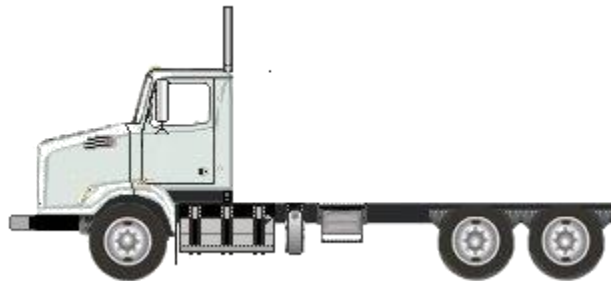
