G. ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS

Mr. Abbey stated the Mayor apologizes for not being here tonight. He gave a report on the following:

- Northgate is leasing the old GM plant building and will be bringing 374 jobs to Burton.
- Trick-or-Treat Trail is Saturday, October 22, 2021 12:00PM at Bentley School.
- Project Heats On is Saturday, October 22, 2021.
- The Treasurer is here tonight to discuss billing.
- Road projects are finishing up. Two of the roads scheduled for chip seal will be done in the spring.
- SRF Phase 1 is in the lining phase of the sewers.
- We will need to have a Finance and/or Legislative Meeting in the near future to discuss pay back method options for the infrastructure at Lapeer Heights.

Mr. Smith asked the administration to send the Finance Committee information for the Finance Meeting regarding Lapeer Heights.

Discussion continued regarding the Lapeer Heights infrastructure and costs.

Mr. Heffner inquired about the cones on Hemphill between Saginaw and Dort.

Mr. Abbey stated that is a City of Flint water main project.

Mr. Heffner asked about the north side of Atherton Road between Term and Dort. The City of Flint replaced the fire hydrants and tore out the curbs. They replaced it with asphalt instead of concrete.

Mr. Abbey stated he would check on this.

H. COMMITTEE REPORTS

Mrs. Conley stated the Trick-or-Treat Trail is this Saturday from 12-3PM. We are looking for people to help set up at 10AM and still looking for people to pass out candy and any vendors that may want to set up a booth. The library is having a book sale on October 30th from 10AM-4PM.

Mr. Fenner stated the DDA had a meeting this morning and have gone out to bid for a welcome area at the closed section of Columbine. I have given everyone a drawing of the project. The DDA also made a motion to contribute \$6,000 toward the Christmas decorations.

Mr. Heffner inquired about the removal of the no turn signal at the corner of Maple and Saginaw.

Mr. Abbey stated he will look into this.

Discussion ensued regarding the removal of the no turn sign at Maple and Saginaw, closure of Columbine at Maple Road, chip seal on McLaren, chip seal on Columbine and a cul-de-sac on Columbine.

Mr. Wells stated it's nice to see that the DDA has a plan to make that corner look nice.

Mr. Smith thanked the council for sending him to the MERS Conference. MERS is going to be purchasing more property and buildings to try to generate more income. They have realized that traditional pensions are not as financially feasible as they were in the past, so they will also be putting together programs for participants such as 401K's and 457's. They will be providing investment classes for employees as well. They have recognized the need to generate more money. I applaud the residents for passing the police millage which helped us free up enough money to keep us out of receivership. I also applaud this council who recognized the need to put the \$1 million extra into MERS seven years ago and because of that, we are ahead of the curve. We need to stay the course.

I. AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION

City Council went into closed session at 7:49 PM

City Council returned from closed session at 8:00 PM.

City Council received the following public comments:

Sadonna Myers of Alberta Avenue in Burton gave an update on library cleaning activities and the Book Sale on October 30, 2021 in the book barn from 10AM-4PM.

Sandra Jobin of Rinn Street in Burton spoke regarding the City Council candidates, the Mayors right to endorse candidates and the absentee ballot drop box.

Michelle Sharrer of Wilson Street in Grand Blanc spoke regarding a Genesee County Health Department meeting and the ability for municipalities in the county to tie into a water system.

Anne Redmond of Davison Road in Burton stated she is running for Burton City Council to make Burton great again.

J. COUNCIL DISCUSSION

Mr. Martinbianco stated it is great news to hear that Northgate is taking over the plant on Center and Davison Road. How active was the Retail Coach in this acquisition? Have we had any contact with the Retail Coach recently?

Mr. Abbey stated I do not know of the Retail Coach having any involvement with this. To my knowledge, the Retail Coach is done and we did not extend the contract.

Mr. Wells asked how hard it will be to put a no turn on red sign at Maple and Saginaw.

Mr. Abbey stated it is not hard to do.

Mr. Wells would like to send someone out to Columbine to ensure there is access for an emergency vehicle to turn around there.

Mr. Abbey stated we will have Mr. Wingblad, our City Engineer go out there. We take guidance on these things from MDOT, the county and the engineers and follow highway standards. A cul-de-sac was not put in because it would have gone out to the curb line causing other traffic issues.

Mr. Wells thanked Mr. Smith for the information he brought back from the MERS Conference. I would like to see the council keep an eye on this going forward.

Mrs. Conley inquired about the old Nightingale's building. I see some work being done there.

Mr. Abbey stated there is a private owner. They intend to demolish the west end of the building. For now, there will be a white box store until they determine what else they want to do with it.

Mr. Wells asked for an update on the traffic at the library.

Mrs. Myers stated she is not there everyday but they stay busy.

Mr. Smith addressed inquiries from multiple residents including Tracy Kedovary and Nicole Gregory who have received a late fee on their tax bills due to the mail not being delivered to the city in a timely manner. He handed out information to the council regarding postal service delays and the city's current policy on billing and fees. The postal system is not as dependable as it once was. I am looking for information and input from the council. This problem is not going to go away. This is something we need to review. He asked the City Treasurer to provide a summary of Mrs. Kedovary's situation.

Mrs. Bryce stated a payment was made through her online banking bill pay system. The bank mailed a check that we received on October 4th. Even though the bank deducted the money from her account two days after she initiated the payment, we did not receive the payment until after it was due.

Mr. Heffner suggested scheduling a Legislative Committee Meeting to discuss this.

Mr. Smith asked for the City Attorney's opinion.

Attorney Doyle stated the City Charter (Section 8.15) requires that we add these fees and charge interest. That is what the Treasurer does. The General Property Tax Act (Section 211.44 subsection 4) allows a governing body to waive all or a portion of the administrative fees and penalties. The decision to do this or not is up to the council.

Mr. Heffner suggests allowing postmarks. Maybe residents are unaware the post office is running behind.

Mr. Smith stated the issue with the post office officially began on October 1st and it is not going away. He urged the council to consider reviewing this.

Mr. Martinbianco asked if we still have a part time employee in the Treasurer's Office.

Mrs. Bryce stated there have been changes in staff and we are currently looking to hire for the part time position.

Mr. Fenner stated he is happy to take this to the Legislative Committee. It is a hardship on some people. Some of the tax money is not ours, it belongs to the county too. There is a lot of information we will need. I would like the councils input and what direction to go, so please send me your thoughts prior to the Legislative Meeting.

Mr. Wells asked how often this happens. If it happens only a few times a year, it can always come before the City Council. We don't have to rewrite the whole rule book.

Mrs. Bryce stated it does not happen very often. Per the charter, I have no authority to waive fees even on a case by case basis.

Discussion continued regarding fees.

G. ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS

Mayor Haskins gave a report on the following:

- We will be keeping the families of Floyd Switzer and Deb Walton in our prayers.
- The new Christmas decorations are in the back of the room tonight and is on the agenda for approval.
- The Fire Department is having a Fire Prevention Event on Saturday, October 9, 2021 from 10AM-2PM at Fire Stations 1, 2 & 3.
- Trick or Treat Trail is scheduled for Saturday, October 23, 2021 at Bentley from 12PM-3PM. We are looking for vendors and participants to pass out candy. Please contact the Parks & Rec Director for details.
- Road projects are finishing up. The cones will be removed within the next week.
- Assistant Fire Chief Vogt has moved on as the Fire Chief of Lapeer. Congratulations Chief, you were an asset to our city.
- The new Assistant Fire Chief will be Greg Pray, congratulations.
- The water tower project is still progressing on time. This may affect water pressure or cause discoloration. There is no need to boil the water.
- A water letter went out recently. This was a procedural thing by EGLE. A treatment was done in February of 2020 to reduce the corrosion on our pipes. EGLE wrote the letter and mandated we send it out. This is great for transparency but the timing of it caused confusion because the treatment was over a year ago. All of our tests have been fine.
- We are waiting to hear back from the insurance company to find out what is covered for the flood issue at City Hall. We will keep you updated.
- Ryan Bertram, our new IT Director started today. He planned to be here tonight to introduce himself however; he is currently working the camera system for this meeting due to the resignation of his assistant today.
- Police Department updates: Contrary to claims on social media, it was not a Burton Police Officer who ran a vehicle into the old Palace Gardens. The bank robbery suspect was apprehended within 24 hours. Body cameras and in-car cameras should be up and running by next week. Speed trailers can be requested by residents by calling 810-742-2542. Monday, October 11, 2021 in the newly renovated training room will be the Neighborhood Watch meeting at 6:00PM. There was a homicide in Burton recently. It was an isolated incident and both suspects have been arrested and lodged in the Genesee County Jail.
- State Representative Sneller informed me the budget has been approved and we are finally being reimbursed for the \$1 million for the Cheyenne/Menominee project.
- The audit will be wrapping up soon and we will have our audit meeting in a couple weeks.
- The DPW gas tanks will be completed within the next two weeks. The Police Department tanks will take longer due to insurance involvement.

Mr. Martinbianco asked for clarification on the water quality issue. If we are using county water, why do we have a problem with EGLE?

Mr. Abbey stated the problem is that we were not notified by the lab. It is more of a technical procedural problem. It is not a problem with the water quality.

Discussion continued regarding water and wells.

J. COUNCIL DISCUSSION

Mr. Smith gave accolades to the administration and Lyndsey in the Mayor's Office for using the digital sign in front of City Hall. City events, meetings and elections are being posted. Thank you to the council for having the foresight to purchase the sign. It is difficult to reach our residents and using the sign is one way to do that. The deadline to register for Project Heats On is this Friday, October 8, 2021. If you know anyone in need, please spread the word.

Mrs. Conley stated the Christmas decorations look wonderful. They are going to look great on Saginaw Street. Have we fixed the issues with the electricity on the poles on Saginaw Street?

Mayor Haskins stated we are looking into getting them fixed and hope to have that corrected in time to hang the new decorations for Christmas this year.

Attorney Joliat stated the judge has a standard fine. I can find out.

Mrs. Conley stated I received a ticket.

Mr. Heffner asked, they didn't take your word for it?

Mr. Abbey stated being a council person doesn't make you exempt. This has been going on for many years and is part of the I & I reduction through EGLE and the Genesee County Drain Office. They have to go in and see that there is not an illegal connection.

Discussion continued regarding inspections, entering homes, placing chemicals in the manholes as an alternative and illegal connections.

Mr. Abbey stated this is a state mandate to reduce I & I. It reduces the treatment costs because we are treating grey water for those who are connected illegally into the sanitary sewer.

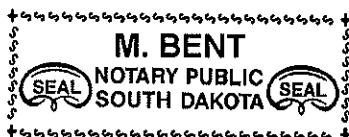
