MTA will be held at Richfield Township on February 15, 1996 at 7:30 P.M. with James Barcia, US Representative, as guest speaker.

A reception was held on Thursday, February 8th from 3:00 to 6:00 P.M. in honor of Bill Walworth's retirement, at Burton City Hall.

Jeff Cyphert, Grand Blanc Township Treasurer, noted that two Bills are being signed regarding credit cards; one for municipalities to allow customers to pay bills with and the other for the municipalities to allow employees and officials to use credit cards when purchasing necessary items for the municipality. By June of this year, a municipality must have a resolution authorizing use of the cards, if they plan to allow them. He said he has a copy of MTA's sample resolution of anyone is interested.
