ELECTRONIC DATA PROCESSING COMMITTEE REPORT - Doris Carpenter

A meeting was held on June 5, 1990 in regards to a New Tax Systems in Graphics. There will be two townships on line for the summer and then the rest to follow in the fall. Those participating this summer are Forest and Thetford Townships.

GUEST SPEAKER - Joe Wilson, Genesee County Sheriff

Sheriff Wilson spoke on "Future Crimes". He explained crimes have flattened out at this point but the violent crimes will continue to rise. The violent crimes will increase with females and will soon equal those of their male counter-parts. In 1960 when he joined the Flint Police Force, females were arrested for writing bad checks, child abuse, etc. and now they are being arrested for murder. Drug abuse has also flattened out to some degree. There is a substance called "ice" which leaves you high for a period of eight (8) hours or longer and crack-cocaine leaves you high for four (4) to 20 minutes. Drugs and alcohol both affect the violent crimes committed. If it wasn't for drugs and alcohol, the mental institutions, jails and prisons would not be in such demand. When a crime is committed and the person is arrested, there is a chance that 7 out of 10 will be re-arrested for committing another crime.

The crimes committed by serial killers such as Ted Bundy, The Hillside Strangler and The Night Stalker were done by caucasian males, almost geniuses with an IQ level of 130. They read different articles and they kill to satisfy a fantasy. There are about 28 serial killers in prisons or jails.

Sheriff Wilson highlighted some of the questions presented to Ted Bundy by the FBI as to what he looked for in his victims. He explained that Bundy was in Michigan but no murders were committed here. However, he did try to get a 13 year old girl into his car when her brother came along and told her to get home. Her father was a member of the Detroit Police Department and a complaint was filed. Bundy has also lived in a normal relationship with a woman and has a daughter. He brutally attacked four women in a Sorority House and thought all were dead but two of the victims lived and then he went a couple blocks away and raped and murdered another victim. He was playing a game trying to stay one step ahead of the police.

Sheriff Wilson said the local officials are not always notified if the criminals are in a certain location. If they were, it would help to prevent a lot of the crimes. There was a question an answer period which followed.
