E. PURPOSE OF THE MEETING

1. P&R 5-Year Plan final presentation

Lisa Easterwood from Fleis & Vandenbrink stated I sent Sue Warren the updated draft of the 2019 5-Year Parks & Recreation plan. The new changes that have been made are as follows:

Page 15 - added DNR IBT trail grant info
Page 21 - updated race series info
Page 22 & 23 - updated school names and facilities
Page 26 - updated map with names and location of Friel early childcare center
Page 33 - added notices for 30 day review period
Page 42 - added IBT trail scoping to top of list
Page 43 - added fire station park play structure to year 2020
Page 46-47 - updated DNR grand min. / max. amounts.

DNR needs a resolution from City Council. If you want to make a recommendation to City Council and you want to do that by resolution, you could use the resolution from the 2012 and just change the dates.

Mr. Sharrer said Fire Station #1 really needs updates and improvements. It was built around 40 years ago. It needs a pavilion built because there is not protection from the sun.

Ms. Warren suggesting asking the new health care business, that is going into the building next to the park, if they would like to partner with P&R to clean the park up and make it more attractive.

Ms. Easterwood stated grants and or donations are another option. The Kiwanis may be looking for a project to fund or the Recreational Passport Grant is another option. This is used for improvements to existing facilities.

Mr. Craig said people from Kiwanis said they might be interested in helping with pocket parks around Burton; however, we really do not have the staff to maintain these. We need to improve what we have right now. Kiwanis did contribute to the boardwalk at Kelly Lake. Mr. Sharrer is keeping an eye on Fire Station One's park and giving updates and I am checking Kelly Lake. We need commission members to swing by Fire Station 2 Park and Veteran's Park periodically and give updates on any issues.

Every child earned a \$2 play bill for participating in the activity and if they cleaned up or helped someone else, they earned an additional \$1 play bill. More play money was passed out for various reasons during the event.

Mrs. Dunsmore said we did not have to do any cleanup on the tables other than wipe them off, the kids did the rest.

Mr. Craig said next year we will need more presents because we were running out of stuff at the end. We will need at least one more person at the shopping area and to direct traffic.

E. PURPOSE OF THE MEETING

1. Trail scoping meeting summary

Mr. Fallis stated the trail by Southmoor Golf Course is the agreed upon trail. This trail would go north to Judd Road. We have heard that the bar at Southmoor should be closed by next Fall.

Mr. Craig said one of the biggest obstructions right now will be getting easement access from the property owners. I am hoping this trail will be great for economic development. When Royal Oak starting building trails, it revitalized that whole area.

Ms. Warren said I like the idea of having double fencing behind the golf course and have the pathway go through those fences. This would keep people from entering other areas that they do not belong in.

2. Trick or Treat Trail

Ms. Bauldry stated the donut holes are ordered. We still need to get cider. The Bentley Boosters are interested in setting up a table with hot chocolate and popcorn. There are no outlets on the outside of the building so we will have to run extension cords. Bentley Robotics and the National Honor Society will be helping us. I will ask

the athletic director if we could have some students help with unloading the pumpkins. The sponsors so far are Carter Lumber, Antcliff, Thomas Beardsley Painting, BJ's, Bentley Florist, Scotties and Johnnies Hardware.

Ms. Warren said other sponsors are Judge Jennifer Manley, Frank Manley, Mayor Zelenko, Bob Slattery, Charles Abbey, Creekwood Dental, Amanda Doyle, Waste Management, Tina Conley, Duane Haskins, Toby Bauldry and Bob Wilson. The flyers will be updated with the sponsors and will be in the paper three times starting next week.

3. Veterans Honor Run

Veteran's Honor Run is looking for sponsors. There will be a GORUCK division in addition to the 5K Run, 5K walk and 11K Run. This is where you carry a rucksack or backpack. Black Forest Catering is providing the food for the post-race meal. We still need to pick up bananas.

4. Pizza with Santa

Ms. Dunsmore stated Bendle is reserved for this event. The school will provide the janitorial service. I will pick up desserts. We can have popcorn and the National Honor Society will be there to volunteer their help.

Mr. Craig said I will bring the water. We could have a survey for people to fill out.

Ms. Warren said the balloon twister is booked for the Pizza with Santa and Trick or Treat Trail events.

5. 4063 : Christmas Glow Parade-Final Decision

Ms. Warren stated the Downtown Development Authority decided to do their own store front decorating contest in lieu of their participation in the glow parade this year due to lack of time to organize and get participants. We still need to decide if we want to have this parade this year.

Mr. Scharrer said I suggest, as soon as our Memorial Day Parade is over next year, we start preparing for this event if we are going to have it.

Mr. Craig stated we have three big events in October and November. We are already stretched pretty thin at this time. If we have the parade, we have to have DDA's participation and help.

The P&R Commission decided to cancel the Christmas Glow Parade for this year.

6. Park conditions

Mr. Craig said I know DPW takes care of the parks but it would be nice to have someone checking them once a week. For now, I can check Fire Station 2 and Kelly Lake each week.

Mr. Scharrer suggested having a church group or student group that needs community service work hours, adopt the parks. The fencing at Fire Station 1 gets

knocked down from snow plowing each year. The snow is pushed up to both sides of the fence. For Spring Cleanup, there were many people cleaning up the parks.

Ms. Warren said we need mulch at both of the Fire Station's parks. This is a safety issue that needs to be taken care of. Genesee Christian would be a good resource; they asked what they could do for Earth Day. A person called asking if she could pull weeds and plant flowers around the sign at Kelly Lake. I told her she could and to let me know if she needs anything.

Mr. Craig said I like the idea of having a group adopt each of our parks and report back to Ms. Warren or one of us.

G. COMMITTEE DISCUSSION AND OR ACTION

Ms. Warren said Lisa Easterwood suggested that we make a list of our P&R priorities. Possibly change our focus on Settlement Park and Pocket Parks. We had a sealed bid on our city owned properties and one of the properties that did not sell was off Atherton Road. We could look into getting this property and putting in a dog park there.

Mr. Fallis suggested putting the pocket parks in the 5-Year Plan if it is not already there.

Mr. Wilson stated the Veteran's Day Ceremony will be held at the Veteran's Memorial on November 3, 2018 at 11:11 AM and the Veteran's Honor Run will be held at Blessed Sacrament Church. The reason this event is held on the 11th month at 11:11 AM is because the Treaty of Versailles, that ended World War I, was signed on the 11th month of the 11th day on the 11th hour. The course starts at Blessed Sacrament Church (6340 Roberta, Burton, MI 48509) and the participants will run through Burton Fire Station #2. The 11k will run through Kelly Lake Park. I am waiting for confirmation from the Atherton School band. I have a retired commander from the US Navy coming to speak. He also works for the VA. The 822 VFW color guard will be there. Mayor Zelenko will speak and the city, VFW and DAV will lay the wreath.
