I was present at the DDA meeting last month and they had many good ideas and seemed to want to help support and promote the parade. Our Parks & Recreation budget for 2018-2019 is \$106,200. The races are not included in this budget. Barry June from Genesee County Park & Recreation wanted us to join in on their 5-Year Plan. We would have to adopt a resolution for that. It would have to be approved by the City Council.

Mr. Craig said I am in favor of doing this as long as we can have a cooperative agreement and still maintain our own entity.

Mr. Fallis said I think the plans are independent of each other and we should remain our own committee. By piggybacking with them, we would have more opportunities for grants.

E. PURPOSE OF THE MEETING

1. 5-Year Plan

Ms. Easterwood summarized the results from the 5-Year Plan online survey and the workshop. She stated that under prioritizing parks to focus on, Atherton Settlement Park received the highest votes and then Kelly Lake. The number one voted route was Iron Belle trail section that connects Grand Blanc Township to the City of Flint. The second highest trail choice was along Center Road and number three was the trail along Genesee Road. For the greenways and water trails survey, Gilkey Creek received the highest votes and Thread Creek was second. Under improvements to parks, some of the suggestions were improved lighting, update bathrooms, splash pad, better maintenance and a dog park. As far as the race events, I think many people do not know about them. The Hot Fudge Run and Memorial Day Run had the most participants. Veteran's Honor Run had the most attendee's. The Burton Mile did not have many participants and many people do not know about this race. Across the board there is not a lot of awareness for these events, so that is something you will want to focus on. Under types of amenities, the highest choice was trails, pathways and playgrounds. Then dog parks, splash pads, picnic areas, benches and fishing piers. People wanted to see more neighborhood parks.

Ms. Easterwood went over different trail options for the Iron Belle Trail. She stated I will be giving the Parks & Recreation Commission a draft Parks & Recreation Plan to review next month. That will start the 30-day review period and then the following month the commission will make a recommendation to City Council to approve the plan. Examples for goals would be improving existing parks, develop a system for non-motorized recreation and transportation networks, preserving open space greenway preservation, expanding programming and increasing awareness.

Mr. Craig suggested assigning someone in the City to check the parks periodically for needed maintenance and repair.

Mr. Wilson stated the Veterans could take care of the Veterans Park. We need to know what we can and cannot do. I would like to get rid of the bushes and flowers. Big plants distract the purpose of the Memorial. An area where people could put a flag or other memorabilia would be nice. Mr. Heffner and I are working on a plan to extend this memorial.

Mr. Craig said by the Settlement Park a building was taken down and I think this property reverted to the City. There was some talk about making this a parking lot.

Ms. Talbot stated I think it belongs to the City, but the question is has it been turned over to Parks & Recreation? I thought we had a matching grant at one time for the Settlement Park parking lot.

Ms. Warren said I know that we budgeted for a gravel parking lot but for some reason it was not done. There is a piece of Consumers land that the old railroad tracks were on at Dort & Bristol Road that I think the Landbank has now. The track is gone. We should check to see if it is possible to revert that land back to the City for the trail.

Ms. Easterwood went over the 5-Year Plan goals and additions.

1. Improve Kelly Lake and expand on nature trails. Continue and improve maintenance in all parks by establishing a procedure policy for monitoring. Explore opportunities for parking lot and other amenities at Settlement Park.
2. Under Trails & Pathways, we need to mention the name, Iron Belle Trail.
3. Preservation of Open Space
4. Under Programming, include Senior Center programs. Coordinate and partner with schools.
5. Increase public awareness of city park system; promote races, establish and maintain a presence on social media in order to address issues brought up within the survey.
6. Partner with senior center, chamber of commerce, libraries.
7. Establish a protocol for donations and sponsorships.
2. Trick or Treat Trail

Ms. Warren said the building usage form is in and we are moving forward on making all of the arrangements. Next meeting will be September 26th @ 5 PM in the city hall community room.

3. Veterans Honor Run

This was discussed under the 5-Year Plan.

4. Pizza With Santa

Ms. Warren said there will be the same type of activities as last year.

5. Christmas Glow Parade

Discussion on DDA's participation in this event. Mr. Craig said we have three major events going within five weeks. We are stretched to the limit. We do need the DDA's help with this.

F. AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION

Councilman Vaughn Smith introduced the Veteran's Honor Run committee members. Mr. Smith said we are continuing to grow. These races are raising thousands of dollars for the community. Twenty percent of the Burton Memorial Day proceeds will be going to the

Veteran's Memorial Park each year. We have Burton Kiwanis members here tonight. We ask that the committee pass a \$100 Memorial Day sponsorship for the Kiwanis Golf Outing.

G. COMMITTEE DISCUSSION AND OR ACTION

Mr. Wilson said I am working on the Memorial Day festivities. I have the color guard lined up and a speaker so far. This will be the 100th year celebration.

Mr. Craig stated we also would like to incorporate that into our Veteran's Honor Run race.

1. Five Year Plan Update

The biggest change was question 8 & 9. It is ready to be posted on the City's website. We can have the Public Hearing before your next regular meeting on August 8, 2018. I have the notice of the public hearing ready and will give this to Sue Warren to publish in the paper. The survey can also be put on the website and distributed to the public.

2. Trail Scoping Update

Lisa Easterwood discussed different route options to connect to the Iron Belle Trail such as multi-use pathways, bike lanes and sidewalks, bike lanes only and sharrows. Sharrows are bicycles and vehicles using the same lane. Ideally, you want to have the multi-use pathways. I will have the pathway options put on a map and available to the public at the August 8th, 2018 workshop.

3. Trick or Treat Trail Committee

Mr. Craig said the Trick or Treat Trail event will be held October 27, 2018. Toby Bauldry and Tina Conley were on the Trick or Treat committee last year. I am hoping they can be on the committee again this year. We need to find out if the new superintendent is open to having this event at Bentley.

Ms. Warren said I will ask Ms. Bauldry about this.

Mr. Craig suggested expanding this event to include craft tables, a food truck and a band. That way we will have a fun event not only for the kids but for the adults also.

Ms. Warren suggested the possibility of using the school hall for the crafts.

Mr. Craig said we need to decide if we are going to have the Christmas Parade this year. We have three other events all within a 5-week period. Last year we did not have much participation in the parade. If DDA would like to partner with us to make this a good event, and we get the participation, we could try it again.

Mr. Scharrer suggested inviting Mr. Slattery to the P&R meeting next month and attending a DDA meeting to discuss this with them.

C. PURPOSE OF THE MEETING

1. 3976 : Memorial Day Race and Burton Mile Race Update

Mr. Craig said we are the largest race series in the greater mid-west area.

Mr. Smith stated we now have Bendle, Bentley, Atherton and Faith Tabernacle involved. We should be receiving a bill from Atherton for the custodians that worked.

Ms. Warren said the Police will not charge for their services on Memorial Day when possible, this is their way of paying back to the residents for voting in the millage.

Mr. Smith said we will still give them the \$1,000 donation. The shirts, medals and Newton Timing are paid. Newton Timing does also donate quite a bit.

Mr. Welch stated the Chamber of Commerce donates \$100 to each race, \$400 total.

The suggestion was made to have the Chamber of Commerce write two \$200 checks for 2018-2019 race series. One check for Race to Grace and one check for Hot Fudge Run to catch them up. For 2019-2020 race series go back to \$100 for Hot Fudge and \$100 for Race to Grace, \$100 for Veterans Honor Run and \$100 for Memorial Day Race.

Mr. Smith said with the proceeds we will distribute funds in the following way: \$1,000 Police, Bentley Robotics \$500, Atherton (Theatre Group) \$500, Bendle Youth Football (Tiger Football Club) \$500, Faith Tabernacle Christian Robotics \$500, American Heritage Girls \$200, VFW Post 2777 \$300, Burton Veteran's Memorial \$300 and \$150 for the Atherton Custodians bill. Balance remaining is approximately \$7,800.

Amber from Newton Timing said we are not sure if we can continue the Burton Mile. A few of the reasons are that we do not know if we will be able to compensate for

the awards unless we get sponsorships for these. The amount of work it takes to put on two races in one day plus Hartland Memorial that we have and there were fewer spectators than expected. Some suggestions from Debbie Newton were to open this race up to include all types of runners, a nice medal, water at the start and finish, porta potties, more sponsors, route moved further north in front of the businesses.

Mr. Welch said if we can get the equipment, we would volunteer to put it up. This was the first year for this race and we received a lot of compliments and positive feedback from it.

Mr. Craig said the roads could re-open after 1 hour and 15 minutes after the race.

Suggestions from Debbie Newton regarding the Memorial Day Race were to have more perks if possible. She said with the cuts to the Parks & Recreation, I am not opposed to designating up to 20% of proceeds back to the Parks & Recreation budget before any other donations. I would also like to see the check from ELGA Credit Union that went to the Salvation Army.

Mr. Craig said we should set up a meeting to discuss how we can better target our sponsors.

Mr. Welch suggested finding a sponsor for the whole event, both races.

Ms. Warren asked from the balance that is left, is any of that supposed to go into the Burton Race Series account. Some of that revenue was in there before the event.

Mr. Smith said not this year. The rest of the money has already been divvied out. This year we are going to make a \$300 donation to the Veteran's Memorial and next year our goal will be to give 20% of all proceeds to go toward Parks & Recreation.

Ms. Warren asked Mr. Smith what would happen if P&R got a \$1,000 donation and it shows up in the P&R fund balance and then later the Council cuts the budget by \$1,000 because it is in there. I suggest leaving those funds in the Memorial Day Race fund and donating them back to P&R when they need it for a project. The money needs to be designated as a donation for it not to be taken.

4. Veteran's Honor Run

Amber from Newton Timing said I put out a survey to all of the participants. With all of the shirts that we did not sell, we took a big hit. In one of the questions I told them that we took a big loss and asked what else besides shirts would they be interested in. Four percent of the response said socks, 13% said hats and an overwhelming 45% said tank tops. Some people suggested buying shirts for pre-registered participants only, tech hats, cooling towels, drink glasses, shorts, flags and capes. Most did not want to pay to have their shirts shipped to them. I asked if anyone would be interested in a kids run and 73% said no. Some of the responses to the question about what their favorite part of the event were finisher's medals, course is flat and well patrolled, ice cream, announcer at the end, community participation especially the Boy and Girl Scouts, honoring veterans, large turnout, well organized, shirts, photos, restrooms, shade, fruit, water and chocolate milk and water, etc. The answers to the question, what can we improve on next year, were cold water and move the water closer to the finish line, kids run, better sound system, earlier start time, more military presence, hotdogs, larger shirts, in memory of shirts, time announced at the end, etc. I have someone already working on our logo for next year.

Mr. Smith thanked Amber from Newton Timing for the wonderful job that she does.

Maxwell Medals will be working on the medal design.

G. AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION

Mona Miron of Burton stated I was on the P&R Commission until 2014 and am in the Burton Historical Society. I would like to know if the sign that was donated for Atherton Settlement Park can be put back up. The park was named this after the Atherton family, who were the first settlers there in 1835. The name has nothing to do with the school. The park has been there since 1999 and was in the P&R 5-Year Plan. I have spent many hours cleaning up the park. I have had Walker Farms donate flowers and volunteers helping me plant them. Mr. Heffner helped put park benches in and I have a picnic table that was donated to put there. In 2015, I asked the Parks & Recreation if it was ok to put a sign in and they said yes. The sign was there for 8 months. In 2016, the sign was taken down and is now at DPW. I asked for it to be put back up in 2016 and the sign is still not up. This \$500 sign was donated to the city and it would be nice if it were put back up so the residents know that this is a park. The grass and weeds are not being taken care of so now you cannot even see the hundreds of dollars of flowers that were planted by myself and student volunteers for community service work. I am also trying to develop a settlement park at Bendle School and Bentley School in honor of the first settlers. I have someone that will

make the sign and I already have a picnic table to put at Bendle.

Ms. Dunsmore said I am on the Bendle School Board and will ask about the Bendle park location at the next board meeting.

Barry June, Acting Director of Genesee County Parks, stated I would like to invite the P&R Commission to join in our 5-Year Plan. This helps us all when we apply for Trust Fund Grants. It shows cooperation among the municipalities, which will earn you more points toward the grant. The State moved up the timeline to apply. They have to be in by February 1st, 2019. Jacob Mauer is also here from the Genesee County Planning Commission. We all work together for non-motorized trails in Genesee County. I would also like to offer our technical assistant if you need any help. Our Parks Commission meeting are on the second and fourth Thursday of every month at 10 AM if anyone would like to attend. We would need a resolution from City Council for P&R to join our plan. Then we would send this to the State.

C. PURPOSE OF THE MEETING

1. Trick or Treat Trail Event

Ms. Warren stated I received a conformation to use hold the Trick or Treat Trail event at Bentley School. I also have the Trick or Treat Trail event flyer available. I do not have the donation contributors on it yet. I have had a few sponsors contact me already.

Mr. Wilson said I could make a donation through the Navy League. I will contact Scout Troop 106 and ask if they can help.

Mr. Craig said I will reach out to Patricia Camp from the National Honor Society and ask if she has volunteer workers for the event. We will need a DPW truck and the trailer, steps, hay and decorations.

Ms. Warren said I will call on the pumpkins. We will need someone to take care of getting the cider and donuts. One problem we had last year was that we bought 60 dozen cookies and frosting and it was so cold that they couldn't spread the frosting. I could bring crock-pots to keep the frosting warm. The Trick or Treat Trail budget has been reduced by \$500. We usually have Bounce houses and a balloon twister at the event.

Mr. Craig stated I would like to try to get more participation from the local businesses. They can pass out candy and promote their business. We can ask Mr. Scharrer if he can gather some scouts to help decorate the trailer. The trailer steps may need some work before the event.
